

This is what we are learning from the ragpicker women of Thane district in Maharashtra, who have been involved in an imaginary initiative by the non-profit Samarth Bharat Vyaspeeth (SBV), which has touched many breathes and changed the way people look at waste.

What started as a small initiative to help a few women ragpickers with a skillfulness and alternate employment by the nonprofit, has turned into a huge success story of waste management which connects over one lakh households in the community, engages with over thousands of children, employs many women and prevents approximately 20 tons of waste from being dumped daily. With the TMC support, SBV managed to procure waste from the corporation and employed the ragpicker women for its segregation at a waste management plant deployed at Kopri, Thane east.



The initiative has been possible with the help of the Recycled Earth App, which was created in collaboration with SBV's partner, Barking Deer Entertainment. This allowed the team at SBV to schedule pickup of dry waste from different locations and in turn the Centre was able to expand its services, and currently manages several types of waste segregation and recycling admirably.

In this issue, we will report several projects and events in which SBV members were keenly involved. I would like to acknowledge Sri Bhatu Sawant, and the members of the SBV project team for their constant support throughout the creation of this edition.

They are supporting there staff in their best capacity as well...

It was overwhelming to see Ma'am and all them working in the scorching heat, selflessly...while talking to Kranti Ma'am, I could sense the real scenario...It's not easy to manage and run a plant with such less resources and support at hand...they face many problems, that we couldn't even think of...but Sawant Sir team are a go getter never give up attitude.

# ONE GOOD NEWS ABOUT ENVIRONMENT

#### 30 MILLION POUNDS OF TRASH WERE COLLECTED FROM THE OCEAN BY 40CEAN.

An estimated 18 trillion pounds of plastic have been produced by humans since the 1950s. Regrettably, the majority of that plastic has ended up in our oceans, where it is damaging ecosystems and animals alike.

Since a large portion of our protein comes from seafood, the plastic found in the ocean can also be harmful to humans. Despite the fact that the ocean pollution is a serious issue, efforts are being made to both clean up and safeguard marine life. A huge accomplishment that brings us one step closer to having clean oceans was announced by 4ocean. They have successfully removed 30 million pounds of trash from the ocean, setting a new record in the process. Contributing to ocean cleanup preserves important ecosystems for future generations.







#### Mrs. Ganga Kisan Deole

aged 35 years, born as an Adivasi in Kopri, Thane speaks both Marathi and Hindi. She has completed her studies till fifth standard only. Unfortunately, she lost her father at a very early age and her mom was a rag picker, but wanted her children to go to school. Ganga left school as the teachers would hit if home work was not done. They were three siblings; brothers were elder to her and have passed away. Her mother lives with her and her childhood was happy with her siblings. They played together games like Kho-Kho, pakda-pakdi, Nimborchya. Mother cooked and fed all of them well.

Her family consists of herself, husband, and three children.

She was unaware of family planning methods learnt much later about them. She had an arranged marriage fixed by her brother. It was a proper wedding with feast for guests. Her husband is ninth pass only. He used to earlier work and give money for household expenses but since last two years he doesn't give anything whatever he earns by collecting and selling waste he uses for drinking. He doesn't cares for the children too. Last two years she has been working at project revitalization doing waste segregation. This gave her an opportunity to send her children to Signal Shala run by some Samarth Bharat Sansthan. Earlier children would go to Nakhva School and she worked at Hari Om Nagar as housekeeping Staff earning 9000/month. She guit the job after her boss spoke rudely with her. She was jobless for three months before joining the present job, at PR, she enjoys the company of her colleagues, and they come and go together. She also shares her problem with them and feels comfortable.

She runs the household with her nephews. Her salary is not enough to take care of all needs and also borrows from work place. Once when her son suffered due to high fever she borrowed from her Mavas (maternal) sister. She loves people who donate, since there's some savings and it works as a support, else there's no savings. She feels envious of people living in highrises. She feels they are rich. They have all amenities, they don't need to borrow.

Their children are educated and live lavishly. Their children wear new clothes. Her children do not get new clothes even for festivals. She wishes that her children should educated and have a bright future.

For Diwali she buys clothes for children, snacks, sarees for herself and clothes husband from the bonus Rs.5000/-. amount of Children's birthday of only males is celebrated in a grand way. She decorates the house, gets cake, and

distributes chocolates to the kids with some home-made snacks.

She feels happy when her mother who resides with her, cooks good food and serves her, she was very happy after five years when her first child was born on undergoing treatment.

In spite of her husband's experience she feels, men are needed. A sense of security however they may be. But not sure at the same time whether they will be nice.

She is a proud woman that she can take care of the house, children, give birth, and work capably with so many roles which a man cannot do it successfully.

Her undoubting spirit and hopes for a bright future for her children, keep pushing her to do best for them, despite the fact that her house structure is made up of wooden planks, bamboo, plastic sheet and carpet pieces and articles from dumping area used flooring to layover.
