Pre-primary

Education for children aged 3 to 6 is focused on developing socialization and independence. Moving away from a family environment with home, mom, dad, sister, and brother to interact and thrive among friends, teachers, is essential for their growth. Group-based learning promotes teamwork and social skills, preparing children to work together on any collaborative task. Through cooperative projects, children learn to work as a team, respect each other's ideas, and communicate effectively. Skills like listening, empathy, and cooperation, which are crucial for positive social interactions, are developed, with examples like folding clothes, making beds, holding hands in a circle, singing together, etc. Cooperative play and other activities encourage social growth. Sharing responsibilities like daily chores, cleanliness, and tidiness in stills responsibility, respect, and self-reliance.






Pre-primary

Activities such as moving within a given circle, throwing the ball in the correct direction, and joining in with the teacher among the children allow them to experience pure joy. These exercises enhance coordination of hands and feet, eye-hand coordination, rhythm awareness, and alertness, making learning enjoyable.



When children think creatively, it enhances their imagination and improves their thought processes, building confidence to express their opinions. This increases communication skills and encourages them to write. Steps in the creative writing process include putting ideas on paper and correcting language and spelling errors.


A crucial step in understanding fractions involves teaching children to think about numbers in terms of parts. It is essential for children to understand how many equal parts of a whole object or value are taken. In class, by dividing real objects into equal or unequal parts, children learned about fractions. They were then asked to draw conclusions, learning that when the numerator and denominator are equal, the fraction equals a whole.


Secondary

Free Health Check-up by Tanvi Herbal Clinic

With the assistance of Dr. Medha Mehendale, Dr. Mansi Mehendale, Mr. Swapnil Athavale, and Mrs. Ambikar from Tanvi Herbal Clinic, a free health camp was organized at Signal Shala on Thursday, October 3, 2024, for the students of Signal Shala under the auspices of Samarth Bharat Vyaspeeth. Speaking at the camp inauguration, Dr. Medha Mehendale explained, "The natural ingredients used by our ancestors for health are still the best for our body today." She shared information about Ayurveda with Signal Shala students. Dr. Mansi Mehendale further advised students on the benefits of adopting Ayurvedic over allopathic medicines. A total of 33 students were examined for issues like cold, cough, lack of focus, fatigue, growth, sleep issues, weakness, appetite, intestinal worms, and constipation.
